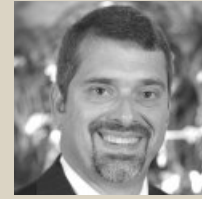

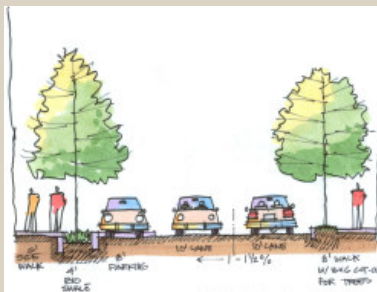
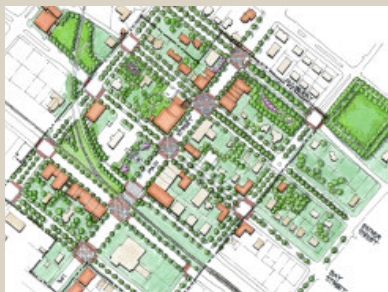
Eubanks authored an article entitled “Taking it to the Street” in the March 2010 issue of APA’s Planning Magazine.
